Engineer Bergman reported that the Maintenance Striping bid requests have been sent out and to have the board award the bid at the April 27, 2021 board meeting.

ROAD AND BRIDGE HEARING FOLLOW-UP AND UPDATES

Engineer Bergman reported DOT stated that technically the County could use LRIP funds for upgrading roads to large hog/cattle facilities, but a project of that nature would have difficulty competing, so it would not likely be funded by the state.

Bergman reported that they hope to get some tiling done this summer on some of the gravel roads and they would like to crush extra gravel this fall to get some put on next year. Bergman stated that this could be a good wheelage tax project, and plans to add it to the five-year plan.

Bergman reported that the Murray County supplier pays aggregate tax for gravel hauled from Rock Township.

Bergman reported that road postings went into effect March 4th. They are starting to be removed in the Southeast part of the state and we should know soon when our road postings are coming off. The maintenance crew plowed 5 days in the past month and started annual crack sealing. The new crack cutter and filler has arrived. Next month's goals include culvert repairs, road ditch cleaning, and gravel hauling.

PUBLIC HEARING DATE FOR TAX ABATEMENT
